To set a positive example to both younger and older Indigenous people.

Meaningful and sustainable employment contributes to reversing these effects.

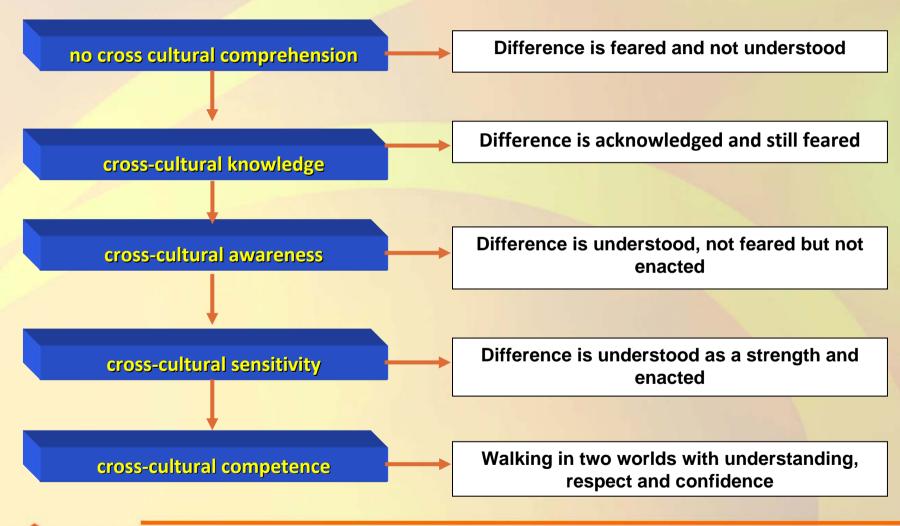
